A **compound sentence** is made of 2 complete sentences joined with a conjunction. Here is a list of coordinating conjunctions: and, but, or, nor, for, so, yet

Example: Mark goes to my school, but Joseph does not.

Ellen likes to go to the library, but Joy likes to go to the gym.

8. Mom could make spaghetti for dinner. She might make soup. **Or**

Mom could make spaghetti for dinner, or she might make soup.
