Plural Possessive Nouns—Compound Nouns

Remember that **possessives** are used to show ownership. To form the **possessive** of a singular noun (or plural noun not ending in "s"), you simply add an apostrophe + "s". To form the **possessive** of a plural noun ending in "s," just add an apostrophe.

You also form the **possessive** of a compound noun, a hyphenated noun, or a multi-word noun (that refers to one thing) by adding an apostrophe + "s"
